What is PACER?

Public Access to Court Electronic Records (PACER) is an electronic public access service that allows users to obtain *case* and *docket* information from Federal Appellate, District, and Bankruptcy courts, and from the U.S. Party/Case Index.

Why use PACER? The PACER System offers an inexpensive, fast, and comprehensive case information service to any individual with a personal computer and a modem, or internet connection. The PACER system permits you to request information about a particular individual or case. The data is displayed on your PC screen within a few seconds. The system is simple enough that little training is needed. The PACER System is available days, nights, and weekends. You can verify all updates to active and recently closed cases without having to make repeated trips to the court to review paper records. If there have been no updates, this can be confirmed in seconds.

What Document Images are Available?

In addition to Court docket sheets for Civil and Criminal Cases, users can now obtain copies (images) of *orders* and *judgments in civil* actions filed after January 1st, 2001. For copies of criminal orders or judgments you must still contact the Office of the Clerk. This service should be of interest to the Bar and Public, instead of writing or visiting our office to obtain a copy of an order or judgment in a civil case, you can simply log onto the PACER system and for ***\$.07 cents per-page*** print the document directly to your desktop in a matter of seconds. The Judicial Conference of the United States limits the charge for a single document to 30 pages, or \$2.10, regardless of the length of the document.

When you compare the cost of obtaining a document from PACER at ***\$.07 cents per-page*** with a cap of \$2.10 for any one document to the cost of obtaining a copy from the Clerk's Office at ***\$.50 cents per-page*** with no cap, the answer is clear →PACER is the way to go!
